

Animal Tracks Information

Deer: Front and hind prints are similar

Length: 2-3 ½”

Width: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Eastern Gray Squirrel: Front and hind prints are different

Front: Length: 1 – 2”

Width: 1”

Hind: Length: 2 – 3”

Width: 1 – 1 ½”

Eastern Cottontail Rabbit: Front and hind prints are different

Front: Length: 1 – 1 ½”

Width: ½ – 1 ½”

Hind: Length: 3 – 3 ½”

Width: 1 – 1 ½”

Red Fox: Hind print is similar to front print, but slightly smaller

Lots of hair on feet, so only parts of toe and heel pad register

Length: 2 – 3”

Width: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Coyote: Hind print is similar to front print, but slightly smaller

Length: 2 ½ – 3 ½”

Width: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Raccoon: Shows five toes, so it can resemble a human handprint

Front: Length: 2 – 3”

Width: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Hind: Length: 2 ½ – 4”

Width: 2 – 2 ½”

Opossum: Front and hind prints are different

Tail prints will sometimes show up as well

Front: Length: 2 – 2 ½”

Width: 2 – 2 ½”

Hind: Length: 2 ½ – 3”

Width: 2 – 3”

Beaver: Front and hind prints are different, webbing will sometimes show on hind prints, tails and branches can mess up the tracks

Front: Length: 2 ½ – 4”

Width: 2 – 3 ½”

Hind: Length: 5 – 7”

Width: 3 ½ – 5 ½”

Skunk: Front and hind prints are different, have five toes and claw marks will often show

Front: Length: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Width: 1 – 1 ½”

Hind: Length: 1 ½ – 2 ½”

Width: 1 – 1 ½”

Groundhog (Woodchuck): Front and back prints are similar

Front: Length: 1 ½ – 3”

Width: 1 – 2”
